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Documents

The passport must be valid for the remaining six months of the date of return.

Visa

The United Arab Emirates visa is required for all nationalities except:

GCC citizens (member countries of the Gulf Cooperation Council): Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar and Saudi Arabia.

Western Europe: Britain, France, Italy, Germany, Holland, Belgium, Luxembourg, Switzerland, Austria, Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Portugal, Ireland, Greece, Finland, Spain, Monaco, Vatican City, Iceland, Andorra, San Mario and Liechtenstein

North America: USA

Far East: Japan, Brunei, Singapore, Malaysia and Hong Kong.

For those who require a visa, it may be process through a local tour operator. Touristic visa validity will not exceed 90 days.
