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Documents

The passport must be valid for the remaining six months of the date of return.

Visa

A visa is required to enter Jordan. Visitors with a valid passport may obtain a visa at any Jordanian embassy, consulate, or legation abroad. A visa can also be obtained at Amman's Queen Alia International Airport or at any other border crossing except King Hussein Bridge and the ferryboat from Egypt. Visas are valid for 2 weeks, but can be extended at any police station.

Visa fees

JD 20,- valid for 2 weeks

Departure Taxes

Exit service fee applies for land and sea border points. 8.00 JD per passenger and 5.00 JD per vehicle.

Currency

The currency is the Jordanian Dinar (JD). Cents are called Piasters.

1, - - JD = € 1,03 or 1, - - JD = \$ 1,40

All major credit cards are accepted and ATM machines are available.

Electricity

220 V. Sockets are with 2 pin European type. UK/States adapters are necessarily.

Time

+ 2 hours in winter and +3 hours in summer than Greenwich time.

+962 - city code (without 0) - number

Climate

Sunshine with temperate, comfortable weather almost year-round. Spring and autumn are fresh and crisp with rain more common in the spring. Wintertime can be cold in the desert, but is pleasantly moderate in most of the country

Water

Water is a precious resource in Jordan and visitors are encouraged not to waste it.

Health

There are no required vaccines. It is advisable to consume foods and vegetables well cooked and drink bottled water and soft drinks without adding ice.

What to pack

Comfortable clothes and sports shoes if you are planning to participate in cultural tours. While visiting cities and religious sites you will be asked to wear convenient cloth and/or avoid low-cut dresses and skirts above the knee out of respect for local customs. Arabic coffee is an important symbol of hospitality, always accept it and shake your cup from side to side if you do not wish any more.

Photography

Please do not take photographs of locals without permission, women in particular.

It is forbidden to take pictures of military and police facilities and please observe the "No Photography" signs.
